National Climate Seminar - *Conference Call Instructions*

Every conference call is free and accessible from any type of phone, from anywhere. Use the same number for each session of the seminar; just dial-in on the correct date and time with your 6-digit conference code to join the conversation.

Conference Dial-in: 1-712-432-3100

Attendee Phone Controls: 4* = self-mute line; 5* = raise hand for Q&A

How do I join a conference call?

Simply call the Conference Dial-In number above at the date and time of the seminar (note the time zone) and when prompted enter your 6-digit conference code.

Can I call in before the host and wait?

Yes. Participants can call up to 10 minutes before the host enters the conference call. Early participants are placed in a waiting room until the host joins the call. If the wait time is exceeded, they will be prompted to confirm the conference time with the host and call back.

How can I participate in the question and answer session?

Our online call management enables the host to mute the entire conference and still allow participants to "raise their hand" by selecting (5*) from their phone. Once identified, the host can individually un-mute and mute callers. *You will not be able to ask a question during the Q&A if you have muted your line for the conference. To un-mute yourself, press (4*).*

Can I email questions prior to the seminar for each speaker?

Yes, please email your questions prior to the seminar to climate@bard.edu. Your question may be asked following the speaker presentation. Be sure to include your name in your email so we can give you proper credit!

If you have a national long-distance plan, are using a cell phone or VOIP service, the conference call will be free. Only domestic long-distance rates may apply as determined by your long-distance provider.
