Nadia Murad Basee Taha, 23, witnessed the murder of six of her brothers, her mother, and fellow Yazidis near Mosul in Iraq. She was enslaved, raped, and brutalized. She finally escaped and was taken in as a refugee by Germany, one of the few countries that has accepted refugees in spite of the political pressures not to do so. Murad is a Nobel Peace Prize nominee and a UN Goodwill Ambassador for the Dignity of Survivors of Human Trafficking.
