Bard Computer Science Program 2024 Moderation Guidelines

Before Moderation, a student in the Computer Science Program should complete or be enrolled in Computer Science (141 or 143), 145, and 201, as well as Mathematics 141 (or the equivalents). In order to moderate, all students must receive a C or higher in each of these required courses. Students are expected to follow standard divisional procedures for Moderation and to fulfill the college-wide distribution and First-Year Seminar requirements. Along with the moderation papers, students **will be required** to complete the Moderation Programming exam. This exam will cover topics from Object-Oriented Programming (CMSC 141/143) and Data Structures (CMSC 201) up to and including linked lists. The exam will be in Java and held around spring break.

To graduate, a student in the program must take Computer Science 301, 305, and 275 (Stats for Computing); one systems course such as 225, 226, 325, 326, 328, 335; at least two other computer science courses, one numbered above 201 and the other numbered 300 or above; and complete a Senior Project.
