Registration Guidelines for Faculty (May 8, 2024)

In tandem with the Registrar's Office (which is completing a survey of all instructional spaces on campus), the Curriculum Committee has conducted a review of class caps for 100- and 200-level courses and upper-college seminars. Having consulted with heads of some programs and members of the Faculty Senate, the Curriculum Committee recommends these class size guidelines:

- 1) Class caps for 100-level courses should remain at 22; courses scheduled in larger spaces such as the MPR, RKC labs, or Chapel may admit more students, however most other classrooms cannot accommodate more than 22 students;
- 2) Class caps for 200-level courses may be set at 18-22, depending on teaching space requested and assigned. In high-demand programs or in programs where 200-level courses serve as an entryway to the major, class caps should remain no lower than 22;
- 3) Class caps for 300-level seminars should remain at 15;
- 4) Instructors of courses taught in special spaces or using specially allocated equipment are advised to communicate with the Curriculum Committee about class caps reflecting those constraints;
- 5) Courses are open to students who meet stated prerequisites, if there are seats available, through the end of the add/drop period. Students should not be excluded from courses, in other words, if there is room for them, and they are to be registered by faculty (or program directors) accordingly.
