

"Why are your collages art and mine not?" Janet Malcolm: Critical Collage presents the first institutional exhibition of the artist's extensive work in collage. Best known as a critic for The New Yorker—where she wrote for over fifty years—and the author of Psychoanalysis: The Impossible Profession (1977) and The Silent Woman: Sylvia Plath and Ted Hughes (1994), amongst many other books, Malcolm was also an avid collagist who made work out of a range of papers that process and reorganize themes in her writing, and which also point to the artist's personal history. 
